

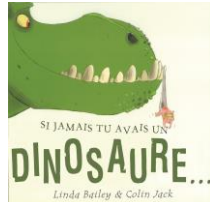

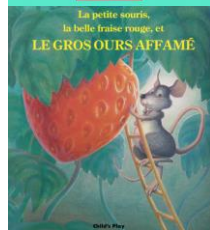
Si jamais tu avais un dinosaure... (2015) by Linda Bailey and Colin Jack

If you had a dinosaur, he could be very useful. He could act as an umbrella, a nutcracker, an anti-theft security system...



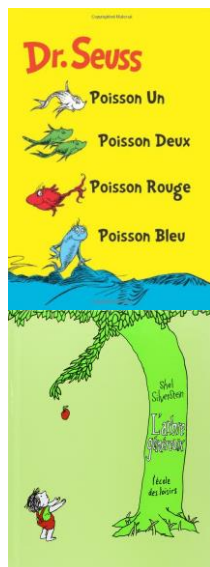
Ça suffit, bonne nuit! (2015) By Jory John and Niki Foley

First published in 1984, a picture book in which the Little Mouse will do all he can to save his strawberry from the Big, Hungry Bear, even if it means sharing it with the reader. The Little Mouse and the Big Hungry Bear are known and loved by millions of children around the world. Little Mouse loves strawberries, but so does the bear...How will Little Mouse stop the bear from eating his freshly picked, red, ripe strawberry.



Poisson Un Poisson Deux Poisson Rouge Poisson Bleu (2011) by Dr. Seuss

Originally published in English as *One Fish Two Fish Red Fish Blue Fish*, this new French translation faithfully captures Dr. Seuss' beloved tales, rollicking rhyme and zany characters such as winking Yink, seven-humped Wump and Ned with his little bed.

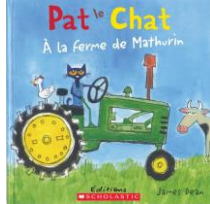
L'Arbre Genereux (1995) by Shel Silverstein

This is a tender story, touched with sadness, aglow with consolation. Shel Silverstein has created a moving parable for readers of all ages that offers an affecting interpretation of the gift of giving and a serene acceptance of another's capacity to love in return.



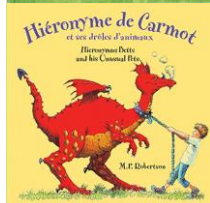
Les Cigares du Pharaon (1999) by Hergé

Originally written in 1932, *Cigars of the Pharaoh* is one of Tintin's earliest adventures. He and Snowy are on a cruise to Egypt when they happen to meet Professor Sophocles Sarcophagus (the first of Tintin's absent-minded professors) and join his expedition. But they become embroiled in a complicated scheme involving a fakir, cigars marked with an unusual brand, and Rajijah, the poison of madness.



Pat le Chat: A la ferme de Mathurin (2015) by Kimberly Dean and James Dean

Join Pat as he visits a farm in this groovy version of the classic children's song "Old MacDonald Had a Farm." Children will love singing along—e-i-e-i-o!—with Pat le chat.



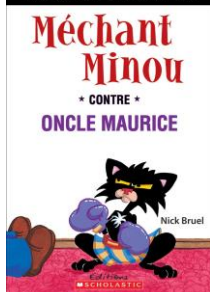
Hieronyme de Carmot et ses droles d'animaux (2008) by M. P. Robertson

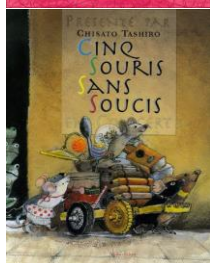
C'est moi le heros: Alerte dans l'espace (2014) by Steve Barlow

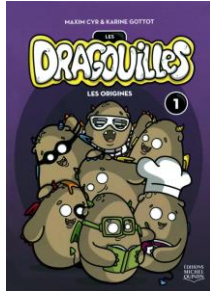
Mechant Minou contre Oncle Maurice (2013) by Nick Bruel

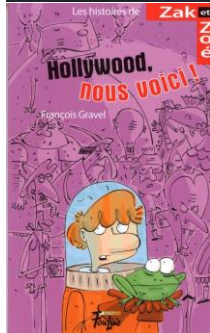
Cinq souris sans soucis (2007) by Chisato Tashiro

The mice are disappointed: they are never invited to frogs' concert. But they have an idea...



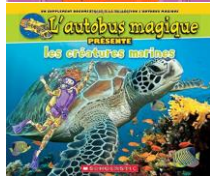
Les Dragouilles (2010, series) by Maxim Cyr and Karine Gottot

L'Autobus magique presente les creatures marines (2015) by Tom Jackson and Carolyn Bracken

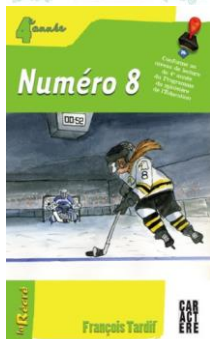

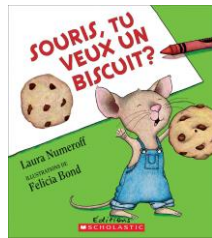
Numero 8 (2009) by Francois Tardif

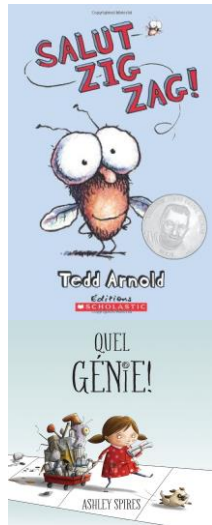
Capitaine Static: L'imposteur (2008) by Alain M. Bergeron

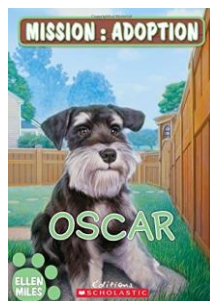
Quel génie! (2014) by Ashley Spires

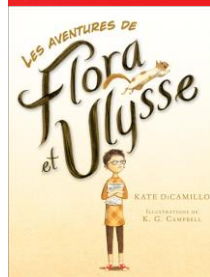
Souris! (2011) by Raina Telgemeier

Who stole all the strawberries from Mika's garden? Lili and her friends decide to investigate.



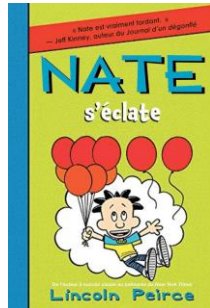
Les aventures de Flora et Ulysse (2014) by Kate DiCamillo

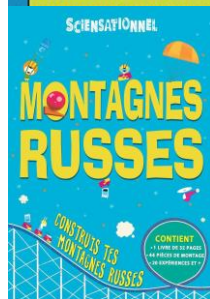
Frisson l'écureuil en pleine nuit (2009) by Melanie Watt

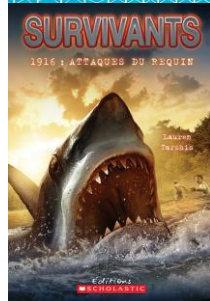
Nate s'éclate (2015) by Lincoln Pierce

Build a rollercoaster circuit and be propelled into the scientific world and learn about the theories of movement.



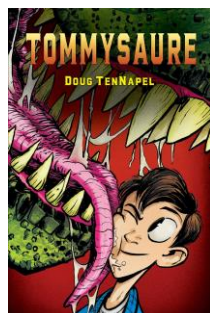
Survivants : 1916 : Attaques du requin (2014) by Lauren Tarshis

As the news of the dinosaur grows around town, so does the friendship between Ely and his Jurassic pet.
